### **BIOGRAPHIES**

1. Garry Wise, Director (Board Member since 2019) – Garry was born in Toronto and graduated from Osgoode Hall Law School in 1984. He was called to the Ontario Bar in 1986. He founded Wise Law Office in 1986. He has completed advanced training in Family Law Mediation and a Bachelor of Arts degree in Psychology. Garry's Toronto law practice focuses primarily in the areas of Employment Law, Family Law, Civil Litigation, Personal Injury litigation, Estate litigation and Small Business Consultation. Garry J. Wise currently serves as Chair of the Legal Committee of the Jewish Camp Council of Toronto. He is a prior Chairman, Legal Affairs and Advocacy Committee, Big Sisters Association of Ontario, where he also served as a member of the Executive Committee for two years.

He is primary contributor to the award-winning Wise Law Blog and was named in 2017 to the Canadian Law Blog Awards Hall of Fame.
